From the Rector

The hymns of Advent are some of the most richly textured of the Christian Year, and this season I always feel sadness for those who do not have access to these soul-shaping words and melodies. The expectation expressed in the nearly mournful strains of Hymn #67 "Comfort, comfort ye My people, speak ye peace, thus saith our God; comfort those who sit in darkness mourning 'neath their sorrows' load....' is emblematic of the music of a season fraught with deep yearning.

The great prophets of Advent are Isaiah, John the Baptizer, and the Blessed Virgin Mary; but also Jeremiah, Zechariah, Micah and Malachi. This is not a Season for the linear-minded, much less for literalists. Time is confused. God has acted and is acting and shall act, and the Messiah who has come is yet to be and shall come again...all at once! God is conspiring toward, and has accomplished, a salvific Incarnation in Jesus the Christ, and we'll spend Twelve Days celebrating that mystery in short order. Meanwhile, something is afoot in our own ordinary lives, suffusing our quotidian days, and we are to give attention.

Advent wonder isn't meant to devolve into sentiment, though it is right that poignant and sentimental moments come our way in the midst of Church and friends and family during these short Winter days. Sentiment, though, is not enough. The prophets and Mary and all God's weave and weal are meant to change us...to convert us.

God kindled a fire in Christ meant to run down the world's canyons and underbrush, igniting the high places; an unquenchable and dangerous flame, hot with God's own justice and the promise of searing transformation. "Herald, sound the note of judgment, warning us of right and wrong, turning us from sin and sadness, till once more we sing the Song...." (Hymnal #70). We will be judged and sifted, and our dross consumed that we might become more than we otherwise would be, participants in the redemption of humankind. The God beyond the myriad galaxies draws near and enters human life as Alpha and Omega, a babe, a Redeemer, a Sovereign. How can we be other than in fear and wonder this season, fairly driven to worship?

Those doing their winter heart-work in preparation for Confirmation into the Episcopal Church when Bishop Diane Jardine Bruce visits January 27th have been put through their paces considering Anglican Church history, morality and ethics, theology and sacramental life. Each class, though, returns to practical divinity: "Lex orandi, lex credendi" the law of prayer is the law of belief; as we worship, so shall we live. How do we worship, and how do we appropriate the peculiarities of worship in the Episcopal Church? Why do we bow when the Processional Cross goes by, and when do we make the Sign of the Cross? Why do some bow and others genuflect when entering or leaving a pew? What is the red candle all about, hanging in the Shrine at the end of the (Continued on p. 2)

transept? These are small matters, adiaphorous, really; yet our interest reflects a deep and profound commitment to know God, love God, worship God, and to let the law of prayer transfigure how we move through our days, how we engage others, the choices we make, and the values we hold. We want to know how to worship more certainly, to meet God more surely, to offer the oblation of our lives and labors entirely to the God whose call and summons we have come to feel. "On Jordan's bank the Baptist's cry announces that the Lord is nigh; awake and hearken for he brings glad tidings of the King of Kings. Then cleansed be every breast from sin; make straight the way for God within, and let each heart prepare a home where such a mighty guest may come. For Thou art our salvation, Lord, our refuge, and our great reward; without Thy grace we waste away like flowers that wither and decay." (Hymnal #76).

We are changed through worship. Conversion puts us on our knees before the One beyond which no greater thing can be conceived. We open minds and hearts, our inner selves, to the sweep of the Refiner's broom, and the straight path proclaimed by the herald prophet. The hymns of Advent, the quiet of Advent, the thundering lessons, the Sign of the Cross, the Sacrament on the tongue...how else prepare for a Savior who will demand of us our very selves, and give us back our true nature in the taking? **GFW+**

A Contemporary Way to Give... St. Edmund's provides a convenient method for online giving to the Church. Parish Pay

is the country's largest religious donations processor collecting funds automatically when so desired from either a church member's checking account or credit card.

This system ensures consistent donations, assisting in the development of parish budgets, and offering ease of donation for those who prefer to pay bills online, or to schedule some payments on a repeating basis. Most churches experience dips in giving during the summer and winter months, and Parish Pay assists the office as it strives for predictable income. Parish Pay handles all tax documentation and provides a monthly giving report as well as providing weekly donation slips that may be placed in the offering plate during Sunday liturgy. Parishioners can direct their secure gifts to the church's general account or to a specific collection, including Altar Guild, Music, Youth and one-time gifts.

Several parishioners have expressed appreciation for the convenience of Parish Pay, and, together with traditional methods of giving, we think it has proven a wise addition to our common stewardship.

It is very important to notify us of a stock transfer as the information we receive does not always have the donor's name with it!

You will receive an acknowledgement letter that includes the date the stock was received by St. Edmund's and its value. If you have additional questions about this procedure, please call the church office.
